# **Super Neighborhood 64 & 88 Meeting**

Lindsay Williams, president of Super Neighborhood 64 and 88, opened the meeting, noting a \$997 balance in the treasury. Freddie Oliver introduced himself as Councilman Willie Davis's director of constituent services. Myra Hippolyte from the Harris County Attorney's Office warned about property scams. Amanda Edwards discussed the upcoming special election for the 18th Congressional District. Gloria Moreno from Barrio Dogs highlighted their youth education, spay/neuter programs, and neighborhood advocacy. Liz from CERT emphasized emergency preparedness training. Ruth Tobor from the City of Houston OEM stressed the importance of evacuation plans and emergency kits. The meeting concluded with library representatives promoting summer reading programs.

### **Introduction and Meeting Purpose**

- Lindsay Williams introduces herself as the president of Super Neighborhood 64 and 88, Greater East, Lawndale Wayside.
- Joel, the vice president, is mentioned as available for discussions on commercial real estate.
- Lindsay aims to make the meeting informative, helpful, and empowering for attendees.
- Lindsay notes the secretary's absence and mentions Amy Dinn's Treasurer's Report, which states a balance of \$997 in the account.

### **Barrio Dogs Program Overview**

- Barrio Dogs offers three main programs: youth and pet education, spay/neuter events, and neighborhood advocacy.
- The organization has been successful in financial growth and community engagement over the past two years.
- Gloria highlights the importance of community involvement and the need for volunteers and support.

### **Community Emergency Response Training (CERT)**

- Liz, a CERT instructor, explains the CERT program and its focus on community preparedness and emergency response.
- The program includes first aid, disaster response, and community education training.
- Liz emphasizes the importance of being prepared for emergencies and the role of CERT in supporting first responders.
- The program is available in English and Spanish, and classes can be adapted to meet community needs.

### **Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Preparedness**

- Ruth Tobor from the City of Houston OEM discusses the importance of preparedness for hurricane season and other emergencies.
- Ruth explains the city's evacuation plan by zip zones and the importance of knowing one's zone.
- The OEM provides resources for emergency preparedness, including evacuation maps, emergency contact information, and registration for the State of Texas Emergency Assistance Registry (STEAR).
- Ruth emphasizes the importance of staying informed through valid sources and being prepared with emergency kits.
