



Super Neighborhood 64 & 88 Council Meeting

October 22, 2025, at 6:30 PM

Magnolia Multi-service Center

The Super Neighborhood 64 & 88 Meeting covered several key points. Council Member Twila Carter discussed the Domestic Violence Awareness Month initiative, including QR-coded labels providing resources. The Houston Police Department reported over 1,000 calls for service, 14 arrests, and 117 traffic stops. The 419 Emancipation Super Hub project was detailed, highlighting its \$10-14 million annual cost and the need for community engagement. The Georg R Brown expansion and Polk Street closure were also discussed, with concerns about community input and alternative plans. The meeting concluded with updates on upcoming events and community engagement initiatives.
